TO THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Gentlemen:

The following Annual Report of this department for the year 1966 is self-explanatory.

The gross cost of operation increased from \$1,743,160.71 in 1965 to \$1,766,998.93 the past year, while the net cost to the county decreased from \$495,137.51 in 1965 to \$489,891.74 in 1966.

As I called to your attention in my last annual report the new Medical Assistance to Needy Persons law was passed and became effective May 1, 1966. I protested the enactment of such a law, but to no avail. As a result, we now have on the statute books of the State of New York the worst give-away program we will probably ever see.

We did not actually feel the impact of this legislation until September of last year. Now, every county welfare district in the state is being deluged with applications for this so-called "Medicaid" and I know of no welfare department which has sufficient money in its budget to finance this program through this year. At the present rate of applications monies allocated to "Medicaid" in the Madison County Welfare Department budget will be exhausted by September of 1967, if not before.

I wish to thank the members of the Board of Supervisors for their salary increases which were granted to my staff members as well as myself.

We also appreciate the cooperation which various city, village, town and county departments have given this department the past year.

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It is impossible to present an accurate comparison of the gross and net costs of the above category of assistance in 1966 with that of 1965 as you will note that the medical costs only include the months through April 30, 1966. This is due to the fact that the Medical Assistance to Needy Persons program went into effect after April 30, and all medical costs became a part of that program and no longer were charged to individual categories of assistance. This not only applies to the Above program but also to all other programs on the following pages.

Doctors' and Dentists' fees also include fees paid to Podiatrists, Optometrists, Osteopaths, etc.

The average number of persons receiving Old Age Assistance in 1966 was 152, compared to 159 in 1965.

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In this program, as in the other public assistance programs, it is impossible to give you a true comparison of the costs in 1966 with those in 1965 due to the fact that all medical costs after 4/30/66 became a part of the Medical Assistance Program and are not reflected in the above medical costs.

The total monthly caseload ranged from a low of 89 children to a high of 134 compared to a low of 120 children in 1965 to a high 132.

There was a total of 232 referrals in 1966 compared to 256 in 1965. The greatest number of referrals, 82, came from Family Court, 61 from families, 32 from our Public Assistance Division and the remainder from out of county, schools and other sources.

The number of children cared for in Foster Homes in 1966 ranged from 62 to 76.

The total number of days' care rendered to patients during the past year was 23,770 as compared to 28,614 in 1965.

The total number of patients under care at the beginning of the year was 78; total number of patients under care during the year was 159; total number of discharges, including deaths, was 74; total number of patients at the end of 1966 was 85.

The gross cost of operation in 1966 was \$249,141.52 compared to \$224,178.72 in 1965, while the net cost to the county in 1966 was \$37,592.26 as compared to \$56,999.90 in 1965.

We were particularly happy to have our Infirmary approved on December 29 as an Extended Care Facility, effective 1/1/67. As a result of this approval we are able to provide care for Medicare patients, one of four public home infirmaries in the state to be so approved.
