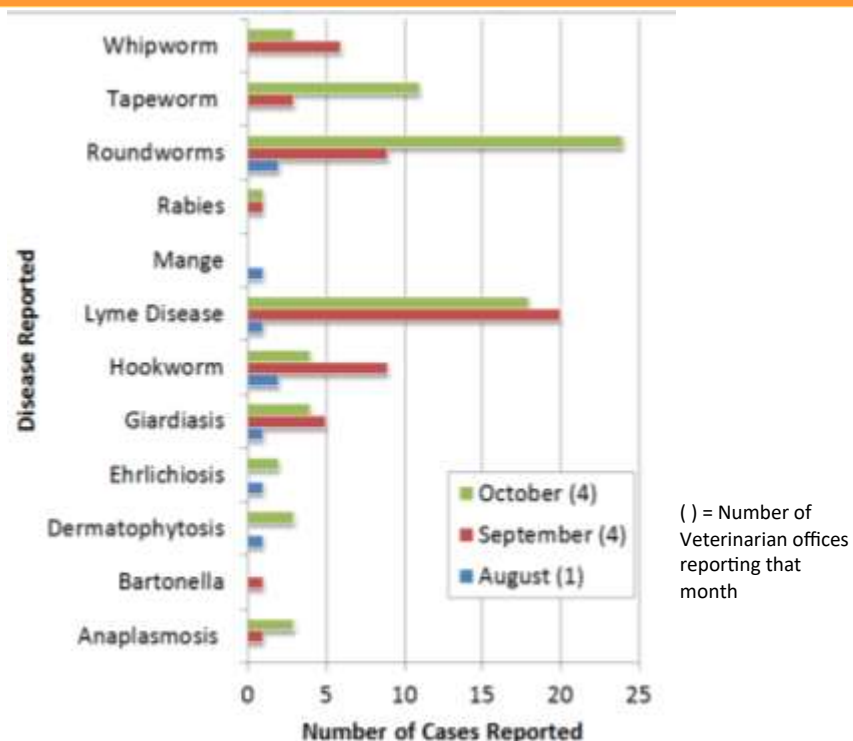

MADISON COUNTY

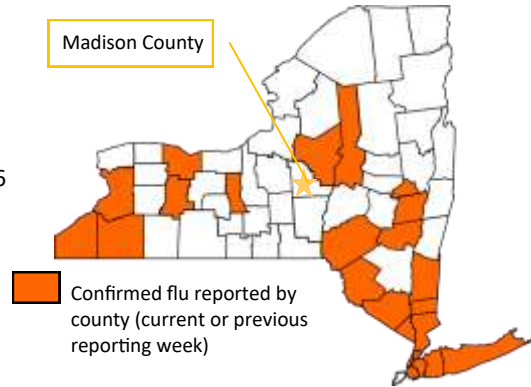
- No flu reported in October

NEW YORK STATE

- 24 counties have reported at least one laboratory confirmed flu case as of the week ending 10/24/16

UNITED STATES

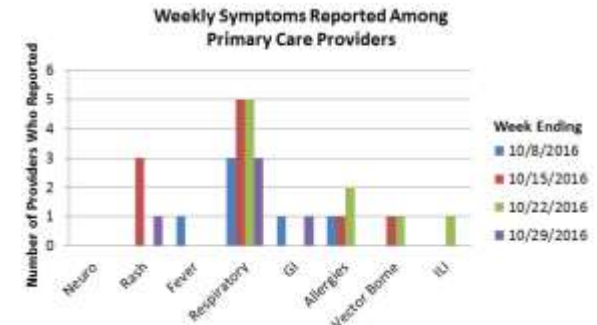
- During the week ending 10/24/16, flu activity was low or minimal in the US with the majority of states reporting sporadic cases of flu.
 - Guam reported geographic widespread flu activity; Puerto Rico reported regional activity; one state (Alabama) reported local activity; 41 states along with the District of Columbia and U.S. Virgin Islands reported sporadic activity; eight states reported no flu activity.
- No pediatric flu deaths were reported
- The proportion of outpatient visits for ILI was 1.3%, which is below the national baseline of 2.2%.
- All 10 regionals reported ILI below region-specific baseline levels.
- The proportion of deaths attributed to pneumonia and flu was below the epidemic threshold.

Madison County Disease Surveillance Updates, 10/2/16-10/29/16

Bolded items were reported for at least 3 out of 4 reporting weeks.

Communicable Diseases Reported to the Health Department: 9 Chlamydia, 2 Lyme disease, 3 Cryptosporidium, 1 Campylobacter, 1 Gonorrhea, 1 Salmonella, 1 Giardia, and 1 Strep pneumoniae

Primary Care Providers Reported*: allergies, colds, coughs, congestion, croup, **ear infections**, fever, gastrointestinal illness (GI), influenza-like illness (ILI), pneumonia, rashes, **sinus infections/sinusitis**, sore throat, **strep**, ticks, **upper respiratory infections (URI)**



Hospital Weekly Surveillance*: allergies, COPD exacerbation, fever, **GI**, abdominal pain, ILI, pneumonia, rashes, **respiratory illness, strep, and URI**

Colleges*: bronchitis, colds, fever, GI, ILI, **mono**, pneumonia, rash, **respiratory**, strep, shingles, staph infection, sinus infection, sore throat, tonsillitis, and **URI**

Syndromic Surveillance in Emergency Departments: No alerts reported

Medicaid Over-the-Counter (OTC) & Script Medication Alerts: for the week ending: 9/25 - 10/4 Mild/Moderate Sensitivity reported for Cough/Cold/Allergy, and Penicillinase-Resistant antibiotics, moderate sensitivity for Penicillin G and Ampicillins; 9/30 - 10/9 mild/moderate sensitivity for Cough/Cold/Allergy, Penicillinase-Resistant and Penicillin G and Ampicillins; 10/9 - 10/18 moderate sensitivity for Tetracyclines
