Instructions

1. Mark only with the pen provided.
2. To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot, completely fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate.
3. To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot, write or stamp his or her name in the space labelled "Write-In" that appears at the bottom of the column for such office.
4. Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting oval or "write-in" box provided for voting will void this entire ballot.
5. Do not overvote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your vote will be void for that office.
6. If you tear, or deface, or wrongly mark this ballot, return it and obtain another. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by marking erasures or cross-outs. Erasures or cross-outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon the return of the original ballot.
7. After completing your ballot, insert it into the ballot scanner and wait for the screen to read valid ballot. You will hear the ballot drop into the ballot box. If no such notice appears, seek the assistance of an election inspector.
