Potential Public Exposure to COVID-19 at Fastrac

Wampsville, NY – Madison County Health Department has confirmed that an individual who works at the Fastrac in Canastota, NY has tested positive for COVID-19. Members of the public who visited the Fastrac on June 19, 2020 between 3:00 PM and 11:00 PM and on June 20, 2020 between 10:30 AM and 4:30 PM should self-monitor for symptoms.

“The Fastrac did the right thing by shutting down their location to clean the facility after one of their employees tested positive for COVID-19,” said Madison County Public Health Director Eric Faisst. “It was determined this employee worked on the above dates and was wearing a face covering while at work. Anyone who visited the store during the identified time frame should monitor themselves for symptoms of COVID-19 until July 4, 2020. Those symptoms include fever, cough, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, and/or difficulty breathing. If symptoms develop, please stay home and contact your doctor for guidance on testing. In an emergency please call 911.”

Madison County is now in Phase 3 of reopening, it is important that residents remain diligent and continue to do their part to limit the spread of COVID-19. Please protect yourself and others by wearing a face covering when you are out in public especially when they are unable to maintain social distancing. Also, please practice good hygiene. These guidelines are for all of our protection to stop the spread of COVID-19 in our community.
