Anyone who would like to be tested should **call 315-464-2582 select option 0 to set up an appointment**. High call volumes may result in long hold times. Thank you for your patience holding on the line. Note if you leave message for a call back, calls-backs may take several days, so please stay on the line to make an appointment.
