

June 6, 2022

The regular monthly meeting called to order at 7:30 PM by Supervisor Stepanski with the following people present: Councilmen Fort, Marshall, Meeker, Shea, Adam Shaver, Pete Kiehn and Joanne Shea.

After the Pledge of Allegiance, minutes of the May 2nd meeting were read and approved on motion of Marshall/Shea, all in favor. Financial report was accepted on motion of Marshall/Shea, all in favor.

Supervisor Stepanski had a report from Deputy Historian Celeste Smith.

CEO Shaver read his report, motion made by Marshall/Meeker to accept his report, all in favor. Shaver mentioned he had reached out to Attorney Langey but had not heard back yet. Councilman Marshall gave Shaver two more properties to address that had the same issues as the Cole Street and Freeman Road properties.

Highway Superintendent Kiehn said paving had been done the last week of May and they were now working on the shoulders. With the escalation of prices, the total amount of the project was over budget of around \$2000 but Kiehn anticipated receiving POP monies from the State that will cover the overage and would like to apply the remaining balance to next year's paving project. Kiehn mentioned that he had talked to Zach & Aaron Wilson regarding a second quote for the entrance/sidewalk at the municipal building and that he did speak with Bob Koen and he said his previous quote would be less since the front sidewalk would be shortened. Kiehn said he was working on the necessary paperwork for a third detention basin on the Brubaker property on Cole Street/Mosquito Point Road.

Highway Superintendent Kiehn also had (3) generator bids for the highway/municipal building: 1) Crane: \$10,200; 2) Curt Rutheford: \$14,097; 3) LaLonde Electric: \$8736; Kiehn said he was waiting on a 4th quote and also the second quote was for a bigger generator and was waiting for a revised quote. Motion was made by Marshall/Fort to award the bid to LaLonde Electric as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$8736 with a Roll Call Vote: Fort: Yes; Marshall: Yes; Meeker: Yes; Shea: Yes; Stepanski: Yes. Kiehn said he had also spoke to Mike LaLonde regarding the generator at the pump house on Middle Road, Kiehn and LaLonde both felt the current generator was still in good working order but would get prices on options for automatic start and an exterior concrete pad.

Supervisor Stepanski inquired into if Wilson or Koen would be interested into giving a quote to repair the concrete at the gazebo, Kiehn will check with both contractors.

Motion was made by Marshall/Meeker to pay bills. All in favor.

Meeting adjourned at 7:57 pm on motion of Marshall/Meeker. All in favor.
