Highway Superintendent Kiehn said they had finished sealing the Salt/Sand Storage building. Kiehn said the necessary paperwork for a third detention basin on the Brubaker property on Cole Street/Mosquito Point Road had been finished, shoulders had been completed on the asphalt paving project and that Madison County had lent the Town a roadside mower with a boom and they will be mowing County roads within the Town, as well as Town roads while they have it.

Deputy Supervisor Shea had a report from Deputy Historian Celeste Smith.

Motion was made by Marshall/Meeker to pay bills. All in favor.
