- sample talking points to raise awareness on the need for community empowerment,
- help to stimulate discussions among stakeholders that will lead to local action,
- recruitment of retired community leaders and professionals with expertise in non-profit, business or aging related fields to provide local leadership
- support for the development of locally based coalitions that will work towards supporting aging friendly communities, and
- speakers at regional conferences to promote the growth of the community empowerment movement.
