

September 9, 2024

The regular monthly meeting called to order at 7:30 PM by Supervisor Stepanski with the following people present: Councilman Fort, Marshall, Meeker, Shea, Pete Kiehn and Joanne Shea.

After the Pledge of Allegiance, minutes of the August 5 meeting were read and approved on the motion of Marshall/Meeker, all in favor. Financial report was accepted on a motion of Marshall/Meeker, all in favor.

Public communications: Supervisor Stepanski said he received a letter from the school asking permission to once again use Carlon Field for an off campus location for the buses in case of an emergency, Cami will send a letter giving them permission. Stepanski received a letter from Madison County EMS looking for letters of support from the Towns in Madison County, motion made by Marshall/Shea to have Supervisor Stepanski send a letter of support, all in favor. Stepanski also had a copy of the email regarding Dog Warden, Sheila Garrett, for the Board to review and said he had spoken with Garrett and she explained the new protocol at Wanderer's Rest. Stepanski also had a copy of the 2024 Water Flushing schedule for the Board to review.

Public comments: no one present

CEO Shaver did not submit a report but had given Cami a Complaint of Violation that was issued to hand out to the Board to review.

Highway Superintendent Kiehn said the RAM pickup had been repaired, there was a possible leak in the oil pan and was looking to purchase a new pickup in 2026. Kiehn said the walking trail had been completed and there was one more bench to install. Kiehn also mentioned they were getting ready to start their fourth round of mowing and that the County had the boom mower to repair it.

New Business - Supervisor Stepanski had the reappointment of Robert Newberry to the Board of Assessment Review. Motion made by Marshall/Shea to accept the reappointment, all in favor. Stepanski also mentioned he was working on the 2025 budget for the October meeting and would have Attorney Langey attend to Introduce the Local Law for the Tax Cap Override and also the Volunteer Fire Fighter Exemption.

Councilman Shea mentioned the concrete corners on the gazebo were starting to deteriorate more and inquired into repairing them. Councilman Fort inquired if the Town was going to actively pursue replacing the Codes Officer now that the solar farm permit had been issued.

Motion was made by Marshall/Meeker to pay bills. All in favor.
