**COUNTY OF MADISON
LOCAL LAW NO. 6 FOR THE YEAR 2017**

**ESTABLISHING A DEPUTY
DIRECTOR OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT**

BE IT ENACTED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Madison as follows:

Section 1. Introduction:

The Board of Supervisors by Local Law No. 4 of the year 1990 established the Madison County Department of Solid Waste and established the position of Director, and now seeks to establish the position of Deputy Director.

Section 2. Deputy Director of Solid Waste Management:

There is hereby created a Deputy Director of Solid Waste Management who shall be appointed by the Director of Solid Waste Management in accordance with civil service law and rule.

Section 3. Duties:

The Deputy Director of Solid Waste Management shall be responsible for assisting in the planning of departmental activities and the provision of direction and administrative oversight to the Department of Solid Waste projects; supervise and coordinate engineering operations and oversee all phase of projects from inception through completion; shall exercise direct and functional supervision over all subordinate staff; shall be authorized to act generally for and in the place of the Director of Solid Waste Management and to perform such duties as may now or hereafter be assigned by the Director of Solid Waste Management; and shall have the powers and duties of a deputy provided for in New York County Law, section 401.

Section 4. Separability:

If any provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this local law and the application of such provision to other persons shall not be affected thereby.

Section 5. Effective Date:

This local law shall take effect when it is filed in the office of the Secretary of State.


