INSTRUCTIONS:

- (1) Mark only with a blue or black pen.
- (2) To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot, completely fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate.
- (3) To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot write or stamp his or her name in the space labeled "write-in" that appears at the bottom of the column for such office.
- (4) To vote yes or no on a proposition, fill in the oval under your vote.
- (5) Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting oval or "write-in" box provided for voting will void this entire ballot.
- (6) Do not over-vote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your vote will be void for that office.

- (7) If you tear, or deface, or wrongly mark this ballot, contact the Board of Elections at (315) 366-2231 or boecommissioners@madisoncounty.ny.gov for instructions on how to obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross outs. Erasures or cross outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot.
- (8) After completing the ballot enclose it in the envelope bearing the Voter's Statement, seal it, fill out properly, and sign your name. Enclose that envelope in the envelope addressed to the Board of Elections and promptly mail it. To be counted, ballots must be postmarked no later than the day before the Election and received by the Madison County Board of Elections no later than seven days after Election Day.
