RE: Vintage Chevrolet Club of America
to tour Madison County Landfill

The Chevrolet Club of America will tour the Madison County Landfill site on Buyea Rd. at 2 p.m. Wed., Sept. 10. These Six Cylinder Tours have been held since 1995 when the first tour was held in Vermont. The six Cylinder Tour consists of cars from 1929 to 1954 and all the vehicles are powered by the "Chevy" six cylinder motor.

For a great view of the cars together, catch them parked on the lawn, in front of the ARC Recycling facility, between 2 and 4 p.m.

The Club has toured sites in Vermont, Ohio, West Virginia, Indiana, Illinois, Virginia, New Jersey, Michigan, Pennsylvania, New York and also in Canada. The Chevy Car Club visits historic sites, manufacturing plants, secret car collections, race tracks and even energy efficient Landfill sites. While in Madison County the Club plans to visit the windmill farm in Fenner.

According to spokesman for the Club, John Pritchard, "There are a few couples that have attended all of the tours but, there is only one person who has attended all the tours with the same vehicle: that would be me." Prichard tours in his black 1954 Chevy and is from Canastota.

Most of the tour participants drive their vehicles to the tour site. Some of the further distances they are coming from would be Illinois, Michigan and Virginia for the Madison County Landfill Tour. The tours are, generally, scheduled for five days and the vehicles are driven somewhere between 230 to 350 miles while on tour.

In September the Chevy Car Club of America will be visiting the Baseball Hall of Fame and other historic sites in Cooperstown, NY.
