### From the East:


Take Rt. 5 to 1st Light in Chittenango - right on Lakeport Rd. to 1st light. Right onto New Boston Rd. - 4th driveway on right.

### From West & South:

Last light in Chittenango. Go straight onto Lakeport Rd. to 1st light. Right onto New Boston Rd. - 4th driveway on right.

### From North:

Take Rt. 31 to Lakeport light - turn right onto Lakeport Rd. heading south. At first light, take a left onto New Boston Rd. 4th driveway on right.
