David Morse	William Talcott	Judgment	4/18/1854	Morse alleges he purchased 1049 pounds of hops at \$0.20 per pound at Talcott's request. When Talcott refused to pay for hops, Morse sold them to another at \$0.15 per pound and sought the difference in price from Talcott. Judgment for Talcott in the amount of \$81.43.
Nelson Wilcox	Ansel M. Thurber	Affidavit and notice of motion	8/28/1857	
Nelson Wilcox	Jeremiah Thurber	Affidavit and notice of motion	8/28/1857	Regarding hop poles.
Isaac DeLamater	James M. Willard	Judgment	10/11/1858	Willard purchased 3000 pounds of hops from DeLamater at \$0.35 per pound. Willard refused to receive or pay for hops upon delivery. Judgment for DeLamater in the amount of \$389.71.

George W. Elkins	James D. Kilbourne	Summons and complaint	11/16/1882	Elkins had a written contract with Kilbourne to purchase his entire crop of hops. The crop was estimated to be a total of 22,800 pounds at \$0.52 per pound. A deposit of \$1000 was paid to Kilbourne. On the agreed delivery date Kilbourne refused to deliver the hops.
George W. Elkins	James D. Kilbourne	Affidavit	11/16/1882	Contract
George W. Elkins	James D. Kilbourne	Affidavits	11/16/1882	Regarding quality and price of hops for 1882 season.
George W. Elkins	James D. Kilbourne	Judgment	2/14/1883	Elkins sought \$28,345 in damages from Kilbourne. Elkins had to locate and purchase others hops at a cost of \$1.10 per pound to fulfill a contract with another buyer. Judgment for Elkins in the amount of \$11,502.42.
Daniel Osterhaut	Joseph Pickler	Judgment	2/16/1883	Osterhaut had a written contract with Pickler to purchase Picklers entire crop of hops at \$0.45 per pound. Pickler did not deliver hops as agreed. Judgment for Osterhaut in the amount of \$1500.22 plus costs.

The People	James Elwood	Sentence	6/19/1883	Elwood sentenced to one year imprisonment at Auburn fo the theft of two bales of hops valued at \$384.

George W. Elkins	James D. Kilbourne	Appeal	2/2/1885	Verdict upheld. Judgment for Elkins in the amount of \$11,502.42.
Orville M. Knox	Max Schoenthal	Judgment	2/2/1890	Regarding poor quality hops. Judgment for Knox in the amount of \$203.01 plus costs.
Miles Parker	Orville M. Knox	Judgment	4/30/1890	Knox said he was agent for George W. Elkins, offered to purchase hops at \$0.22 per pound. On delivery Knox refused hops stating that they were of poor quality. Knox then offered to try to sell them elsewhere at a lower price per pound. Knox was able to sell at \$0.09 per pound. Judgment for Parker in the amount of \$1700.74.

William Purcell et al	George Lawrence et al	Judgment	4/21/1891	Purcell sold to Lawrence a quantity of malt. Oneid Valley National Bank would not cash Lawrnce's checks. Lawrence claimed that the malt was of poor quality. Judgment for Purcell in the amount of \$3013.88 plus costs.
Charles A. Stringer	Amadeus Hinman Sr.	Summons and complaint	10/28/1891	Stinger sold lumber etc amounting to \$113.86 to Hinman for constructing a hop kiln. Payment not received.
Ernest G. Lewis	Abram Smith	Judgment	11/18/1891	Smith was indebted to Lewis for the purchase of seed, feed, a bull, and various hop-related items in the amount of \$399.05. Partial payment was received by way of the sale of hops. Judgment for Lewis in the amount of \$255.30 plus costs.
