

MADISON COUNTY RECYCLING GUIDE

Madison County offers a number of specialized recycling programs for the convenience of its residents.

Madison County continues to be a leader in solid waste management in New York State, thanks to you: the good citizens of Madison County.

The following items are accepted at county transfer stations in the Towns of Cazenovia, Hamilton and Sullivan, and at the County Landfill in the Town of Lincoln except where indicated.

- Antifreeze* 5 gal limit
- Cell Phones – no charge
- Clear plastic bags - no charge
- Computer Monitors & Televisions
- Ink Jet Cartridges – no charge
- Propane tanks*
- Refrigeration units *
- Scrap metal – no charge
- Used motor oil - no charge • 5 gal limit
- Vehicle tires
- White Goods (washers, stoves, water heaters, etc.) – no charge
- Yard waste** (grass clippings, leaves, branches) – no charge

* Only accepted at the Buyea Rd. landfill site.

**As part of this successful program, residents are welcome to take composted materials free of charge from the three county transfer stations and the landfill (when available)

NOTE

- A few of the items listed are not handled routinely by some trash haulers. If in doubt, call your hauler.
- Some items may require disposal fee. The fee schedule is listed on the back of the solid waste disposal punch card.
- The Cazenovia, Hamilton and Sullivan transfer stations have receptacles provided by the Salvation Army for small items which, although being discarded can be re-used.

Special Program

Madisons County's Household Hazardous Waste Disposal is Fast and Easy in Madison County and FREE

If you have Internet access go to madisoncounty.ny.gov/hwf - fill out the form and press the submit button. DONE!

You will receive an e-mail response, generally, within five working days. Download your information packet that includes a map and your appointment date. Take all paperwork with you to the appointment. Your destination is Environmental Products and Services on Hiawatha Blvd. In Syracuse – just down the street from Carousel Mall.

If you do not have internet access – call the Solid Waste Hotline at 1-800-721-2208 and request a Household Hazardous Waste appointment form. This method takes longer, but works just as well.

Madison County residents can dispose of 14 wet gallons and 20 dry pounds of household hazardous waste for free – yes, that is right – for FREE, five days a week all year long!

Paper Products and Cardboard

<p>Yes: All newspaper and inserts</p> <p>Yes: Junk mail and envelopes</p> <p>Yes: Magazines & Catalogs</p> <p>Yes: All Boxboard such as: cereal and other food boxes, gift and tissue boxes, paper towel/toilet rolls</p> <p>Yes: Corrugated cardboard boxes</p> <p>Yes: Pizza boxes</p> <p>Yes: Telephone books</p> <p>Yes: Non-metallic greeting cards & wrapping paper</p> <p>Yes: Paper bags</p> <p>Yes: Plastic retail bags</p>	<p>No: Soiled or wet paper</p> <p>No: Carbon or wax paper</p> <p>No: Folders with metal parts (or spiral books)</p> <p>No: Tissue paper</p> <p>No: Plastic over-wrap</p> <p>No: Milk or juice cartons</p> <p>No: Wax-coated corrugated</p> <p>No: <u>Frozen food, refrigerated or microwave product boxes</u></p> <p>No: Styrofoam products</p> <p>No: Soda & beer cartons & carriers</p> <p>No: Packaging with plastic or foil coatings or liners</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * All items need to be clean and dry * Remove all plastic liners * Flatten and make into bundles * Material may be placed together in a clear plastic bag or loose in recycling bin * Set out next to or on top of recycling bin, if one is used * Protect from the rain * Do not tie with tape or wire <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;">   </div>

Textiles

<p>Yes - All clean, dry clothing, shoes, sneakers, blankets, sheets, sleeping bags and belts</p> 	<p>No: Rugs or carpets</p> <p>No: Plastic or rubber items</p> <p>No: <u>Moist, wet, oily, torn</u> or <u>stained</u> materials</p> <p>No: Small fabric scraps</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Buttons and zippers are okay * Place Textiles in sealed clear plastic bag. * Set out next to or on top of recycling bin, if one is used

KEEP PAPER AND TEXTILES SEPARATE FROM CONTAINERS

How to Recycled Containers: All glass, plastic and metal containers may be placed together in the same clear plastic bag or recycling bin. Remove and discard plastic lids and caps and rinse containers thoroughly.

These should be placed in the Scrap Metal container at any county transfer stations</p>
