The meeting was called to order by Committee Chairman Daniel S. Degear at 8:45 a.m. in the Supervisors Chambers.

Minutes:

The minutes of the December 18, 2014 meeting were unanimously approved on the motion of Supervisor Bargabos and second of Supervisor Carinci.

Public Defenders:

Public Defenders Director Paul Hadley presented changes requested by the Madison Legal Defense Bureau to the contract approved by the Board of Supervisors on December 22nd. The changes would eliminate Madison Legal Defense Bureau's handling of appeals, and add language to ensure that interpreter services, psychological reports, expert witnesses, investigator fees, and transcript fees are recognized as extraordinary expenses. After consulting with First Assistant County Attorney Tina Wayland-Smith on the proposed changes, the Committee agreed to the changes. Tina Wayland-Smith will draft a resolution to approve the requested changes and enter into the revised agreement:

Authorizing Agreement with Madison Legal Defense Bureau, Inc. to represent indigent criminal defendants

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Salka and second of Carinci.

Paul reported that he received a grant for \$24,000 to scan files that was to be spent in 2014; however, it has been extended to 2015. Tina reported that a grant for Indigent Legal Services was submitted today that will provide approximately \$75,000 for the next 3 years to fund the Public Defender's Office.

E911/Communications:

E911 Director Paul Hartnett presented the following resolution:

Authorizing the Chairman to enter into an MOU with the 2-1-1 Finger Lakes Call Center

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Salka and second of Jones.

Paul stated that The United Way of the Valley and Greater Utica Area is launching "211" on February 11th for Herkimer, Madison, and Oneida Counties. The Board of Supervisors will be receiving an invitation to this event which will take place on February 11th at 10:00 am at the State Office Building in Utica.

Paul will be drafting a letter to the Bridgeport Fire Chief regarding his department responding to emergencies on the Onondaga County System when dispatched by Madison County. He will send the letter to the County Administrator for review before sending.

At Village of Chittenango Police Chief Fred Corey's request, Mark Scimone met with Chief Corey on January 21st as a follow-up to the December 18th meeting between Madison County and the Village of Chittenango and the discussion regarding dispatching concerns and participation in a countywide Records Management System (RMS). Chief Corey didn't like how things were left and wanted to meet with Mark to get a better understanding of some items that were discussed. The meeting went well. Chief Corey shared his concerns about joining County's system including the training it would require. Mark discussed the need to work cooperatively to provide the best service for the residents of Madison County. Although the Village of Chittenango is not ready to join the County's RMS at this time, it is something they may consider down the road.

Paul spoke with Oneida Police Chief David Meeker and stated that his police department may join down the road also. Paul will keep all of the agencies, including those that aren't ready to join, engaged as we progress.

Sheriff's Office:

Undersheriff Ball presented the following resolutions:

Authorizing Chairman to Enter into License Agreement with National Children's Alliance

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Jones and second of Bargabos.

Authorizing Chairman to Enter into Accreditation Agreement with National Children's Alliance

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Carinci and second of Salka.

Re-appointing members to the Madison County Traffic Safety Board

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Jones and second of Bargabos.

Re-appointing a supervisor to the Jury Board

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Carinci and second of Bargabos.

Authorizing the Chairman to renew an agreement with the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Bargabos and second of Salka.

Drug Enforcement & Animal Control

Supervisor Salka informed the Committee that a young man from Brookfield is in critical condition after smoking marijuana laced with methamphetamine. Drugs are getting out of control in Brookfield and are becoming a terrible epidemic throughout the County. Poor communities are being devastated by this and it is causing a security threat for all communities. This is a mental health, public health, and societal issue as well as a law enforcement issue that this Committee should be looking at.

Undersheriff Ball stated that drug related crimes and deaths have skyrocketed over the past two

years, and the Sheriff's Office is working closely with all regional agencies to do everything they can to handle it. The County's narcotics team ramped up six months ago and our undercover investigators are passionate and committed to their work; however, resources could always be improved upon. Salka stated that if resources are inadequate, it should be brought to the Board's attention.

Supervisor Carinci stated that full-time animal cruelty investigators are also needed throughout the county. Undersheriff Ball stated that there are four deputies with baseline training and they are very active handling animal cruelty and control cases.

Chairman Degear stated that legal research and more background knowledge are needed. This Committee and the Sheriff's Office need to work together on drug issues and animal control issues countywide.

Government Official/Emergency Responder Placards

Chairman Degear stated that Sheriff Riley provided placards for town supervisors that can be placed on their visors to gain access to emergency management sites during an emergency response event. Before distributing the placards, it is important that the elected officials receive training on their authorities and roles during a natural disaster or state of emergency situation. TEEX can provide a 2 ½ hour training for the Board of Supervisors to ensure that they understand their responsibilities. Joe DeFrancisco has grant funds that would cover the expense. The Committee recommended that the training be held on a Board Day and be held every two years thereafter. It should also be included as part of the orientation program for new supervisors. After receiving the County Attorney's and Chairman Becker's input and approval, the Committee agreed to move forward with the training and will stress the importance of this training to their colleagues.

Emergency Preparedness:

Town of Lebanon Ambulance Service

Emergency Preparedness Director Joe DeFrancisco addressed the Town of Lebanon Ambulance Service issue. The Town of Hamilton has submitted a proposal for an ambulance district which includes a portion of Lebanon; a public hearing was held in Hamilton yesterday. Lebanon is currently protected by three ambulance services. There is a concern of annexation for the Town of Lebanon.

DeFrancisco stated that in the 1970's Georgetown filed their certificate of need incorrectly and territories not included in the certificate of need were billed to Medicare. Nelson and Lebanon were advised to file a municipal certificate of need so they can choose the service they want for their town, although this makes it difficult to determine response times and to get data for billing insurance. Mutual aid agreements can be a stressed system with inconsistencies, especially with volunteers. Constancy of service is best with paid responders. Former Town of Sullivan Supervisor John Gladney established a local law that allowed the town to bill a minimal fee for every ambulance ride, which creates an incentive to use the ambulance service responsibly.

Supervisor Salka stated that we may need to consider a county-level solution.

Emergency Response Kits

DeFrancisco stated that \$24,000 of department funds was spent on 198 Emergency Response Kits to manage mass casualty incidents. One bag can handle six ballistic injuries and are used effectively in Afghanistan and Iraq. He began distributing the bags throughout the County on Sunday.

This represents no increase of the budgeted amount from the previous year. The total amount of compensation shall not exceed Forty Seven Thousand Seventy Two Dollars (\$47,072); and
